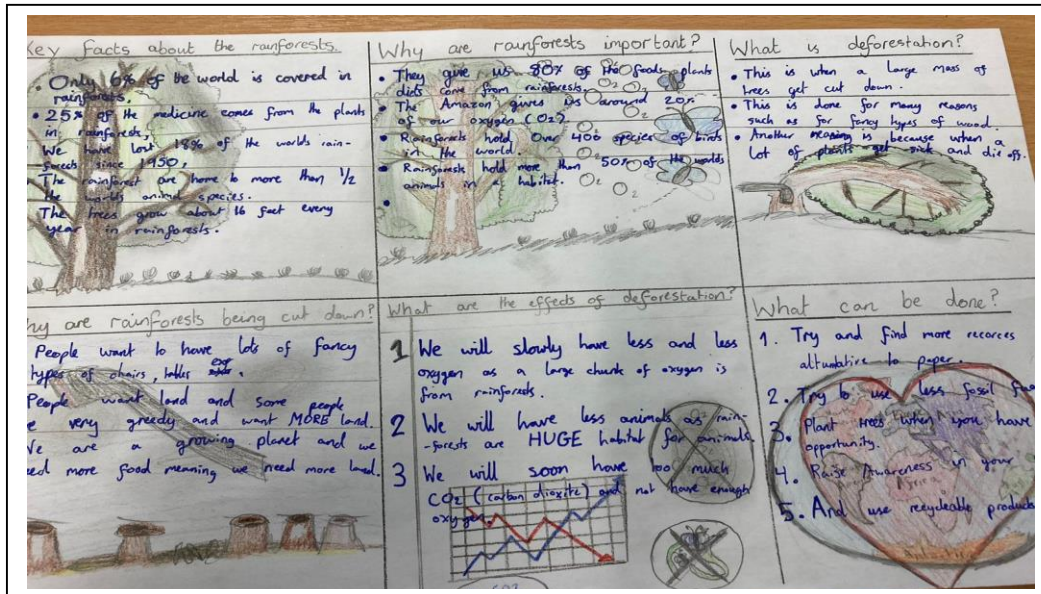

Conduct of Parents

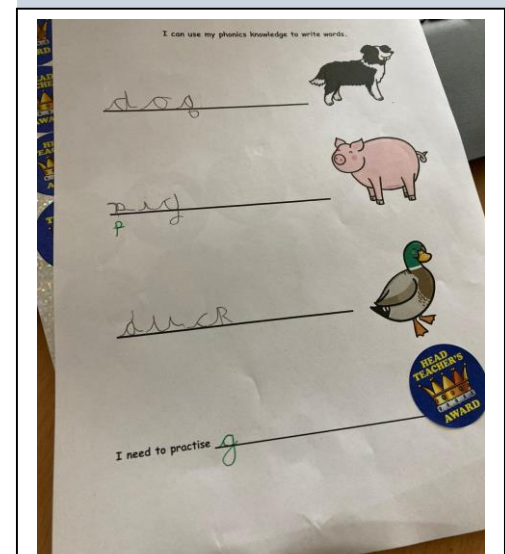
