
Eythorne Elvington CP School

Medication

If at any time your child needs to be taking medication whilst at school please bring this directly to the office and complete the necessary paperwork.

Breakfast and After School Clubs

Breakfast club has continued as normal from 8am. Within the hall, children are positioned within their class bubbles whilst continuing to receive a healthy breakfast and being able to engage in morning activities.
