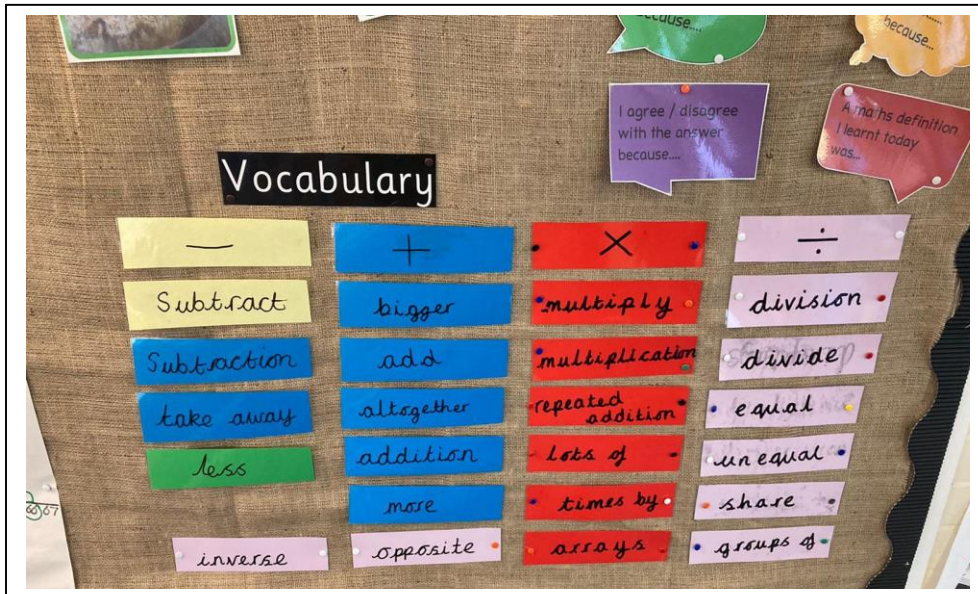

Year 6 SATS

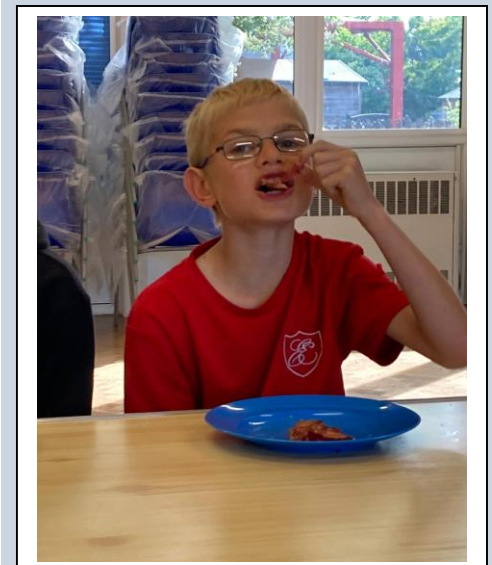
