Boiler

Since then, I have been in regular meetings with Kent County Council and as I indicated in my letter earlier in the week, we now have heaters in place should this occur again enabling children and staff to safely attend school.

COVID

We have had a couple of positive COVID cases this week with pupils and they are currently self-isolating at home. You may have noticed in the latest update from Government yesterday that this self-isolation period has been reduced to five days instead of seven depending on negative test results. Moving forwards, should we receive a positive case within a class, I will be writing to parents of all children in the class explaining the situation and advising that you carry out a lateral flow test on your child prior to returning to school the next day.

Farm School

The children in Columbia class had their first Farm School session on Wednesday which is great news. These sessions with Woodpecker Court are a brilliant experience for the children as part of our wide curriculum aims. Please ensure that if your child is in Columbia class they have a pair of wellington boots in school for these sessions and a warm coat (even when the sun is out!)

Mrs Sutcliffe has arranged for the children in Voyager and Atlantis classes to take part in a Florence Nightingale Workshop in school on Tuesday 1st February. This valuable experience is linked to their learning this term and an opportunity I am sure that they will thoroughly enjoy. 


