
# Eythorne Elvington CP School

As the latest set of COVID restrictions look to relax on Monday 17th it has been interesting to consider all of the changes that have taken place in school over the past 14 months and look at what has changed for the better and what we cannot wait to get back to normal with!

At present, we are still awaiting updated guidance from the DFE with regards to meeting via zoom 6pm what alterations there may be to the advice in schools from Monday onwards. Until we hear differently, I ask that all parents continue to wear a face mask when on the school grounds and that we consider social distancing when waiting on the playground. The one-way system in and out of school – helped by the newly laid pathway – is working well and this is something I would imagine we will consider in the future regardless.

Another change that has benefitted the children greatly has been the lengthened drop off times since September, allowing children to come into school from 8.30am onwards. It is great to see the vast majority of our children in school at this time and it allows them to engage in the Morning Work activities set by the teachers which are aimed at securing their Maths and English skills further. It is vital that ALL children are in school by 8.50am so that children can get this solid start to the school day. Arriving at 9am, means they miss an hour a week - which over the course of a school year makes a huge difference.

In school, we are now able to bring tables into groupings instead of rows – this is key to enabling children to discuss learning with each other and is also a better layout for groups with and without adult support. The introduction of wearing PE kits on a Friday has been a success and is again something that is likely to stay long term. Thank you to all parents who have ensured that their child has the correct PE House T-Shirt and Hooded top to enable this to be as successful as it has been.

With two weeks left before the half term break, we will continue to assess where the children are at and what teaching needs to take place in Term 6 to get the children as near to their end of year assessment targets as possible. Term 6 will be an important six weeks of teaching and learning and I encourage all parents to continue to engage at home with their children in reading, phonics, times tables and spellings as and when you can.
