I hope that those families who joined in, enjoyed it – we will be back next Friday for more of the same. This afternoon, I will attempt a whole school Zoom assembly – it will be good to have the opportunity to just say hello to the children and to congratulate them on all that they have been doing so far – plus, it could be seen as a small window for parents to have a break!

I would like to finish this newsletter by just saying, parents you are doing a great job – there is no manual as to how to do this remote learning stuff whilst everything else is going on – just give your child lots of love and support, that is more than good enough.


