# LAST DAY OF TERM

I have made the decision that on the final day of term (Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> July) children can be collected by parents at 1pm. For those parents who have work commitments preventing them from being able to do this, they can either collect their children at 3.10pm as normal or by using the after-school club facility. All children will have their school lunch as normal on Thursday and then register in class before being brought out onto the playground at 1pm. Those remaining with us for the rest of the afternoon, will return to the class to take part in some activities and will also come along with staff to the Year 6 Leavers assembly out on the field at 2pm. Please note, all Year 6 pupils will stay in school in preparation for their leaver's assembly as mentioned below.

## YEAR 6 LEAVERS ASSEMBLY

The Year 6 Leavers Assembly will take place at 2pm on Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> July. There is no limit to the number of family members who may want to attend this event. We ask that just before 2pm, all those attending gather on the KS2 playground where a member of staff will sign you in before you make your way around to the rear of the school where the assembly is held. Once the assembly is complete, all Year 6 students are free to leave with their adults.

## COVID 19

From Monday onwards there is a further lifting of restrictions around COVID 19, however, the clarity of those surrounds schools is —to be honest — as vague as it has been throughout. We are lead to believe that if we have a positive case in school; it is no longer our responsibility to deal with this and is in fact down to the Track and Trace mechanism. Anyway, as always, my mantra has been and will remain that should there be a case in school (either staff member or pupil), I will liaise with the correct authorities and communicate the necessary next steps with all members of the school community.

On the playground from Monday, it is no longer a legal requirement for adults to wear masks or socially distance, although this is at the discretion of each individual adult. I would ask all parents to respect the fact that many of us have different thoughts and opinions on COVID and bear this in mind when on the school grounds. If you need to enter the school building, we will ask you to wear a mask in any communal areas.

In school, the children will continue to operate in their two key stage bubbles for the remaining four days of term. Staff at school have the option of wearing a mask/face shield depending upon what their preference is.
