As the weather continues to heat up, please can parents ensure you are applying sun cream to your child in the morning before they come to school and also ensure they bring a water bottle to school with them.

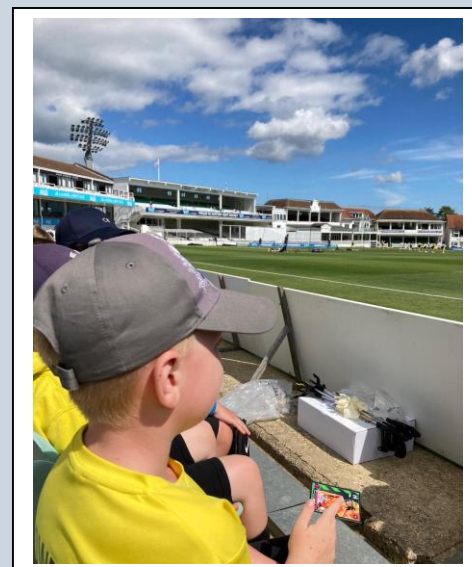
