Welcome back to another exciting term at school. We are now over half way through this academic year and there is still so much left to look forward to before the end of July. Before the half term break, we had our Science Focus Week here at school. Across many of the afternoons, all children were engaging in a variety of Science related activities. Many thanks to our Chair of Governors Dr Webster and his wife, for coming in to work with our children in Key Stage Two on a forensic science activity. Other sessions included opportunities to hold a range of animals brought in by the Wild Science Company, time in the Forest School and an inter-house rocket launching competition. This term, the children in Years 4,5 and 6 will have Forest School sessions on a Friday with Mrs Wilkinson-Tough. These sessions are fortnightly and the first of these will take place on Friday 2nd March. In addition to this, there is an extra Forest School session for Years 1,2 and 3 THIS WEDNESDAY (21st February). The reason for this, is that last term Mrs Wilkinson-Tough was unable to attend on one of the Friday sessions due to illness. Please ensure as always that children bring with them to school additional warm clothing and wellington boots. As a school we can help by providing waterproofs.
