In every class, the majority of the class walked to school, with Endeavour class showing the highest percentage with 61% of their children walking to school. Can I please remind you that between the hours of 8.30—9.00am and 3.00—3.30pm there should be **no cars** entering the school premises (unless for disability purposes). There are a lot of children either coming in to or leaving the school at this time and their safety is paramount.

Please can you also be aware of your use of language when in and around the school. There have been some reports from parents of overhearing language not suitable for children to be around.

Over the course of this academic year we will be working in partnership with Sibertswold Primary on a **charity project** linked to supporting a community in Burkina Faso. This project is lead by Mr Lamb, Head of School at Sibertswold, and he will soon be speaking to the children of Eythorne Elvington about this project in more detail.

It was nice to see so many children enjoying the **extra- curricular clubs** on offer at the school last week. There are some places still available in some clubs so if your child wishes to join then please contact the school office.
