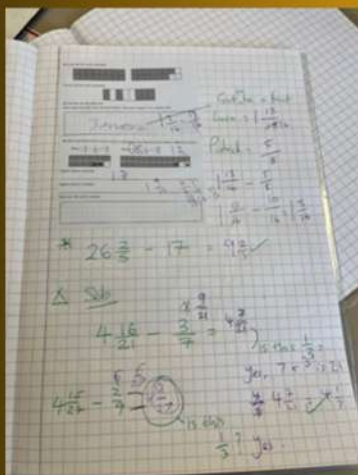
Attendance This Week
