

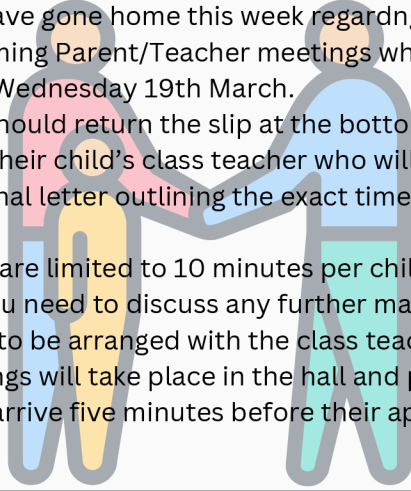

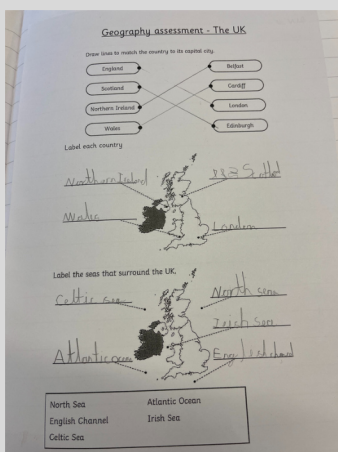
Attendance This Week
