Dear Parents/Carers

Welcome back to another new term and another new year! We hope you all enjoyed the Christmas break and it was good to see the children straight back into their learning last Thursday.

Reading Challenge

In assembly last week, we spoke about setting goals for the next twelve months at this time of year. We mentioned the importance of reading, and how this should be a goal for all children. Last term, Mrs Sutcliffe set up a new whole school reading challenge where pupils are encouraged to read every day. It is important that the children know they can be reading all sorts of materials as well as books; these could be comics, magazines, newspapers, cook books etc. It would really help the development of your child if you were able to further support this at home and encourage them to find the time after school to read either to an adult or sibling or to themselves. In Friday's assembly 28 children were given a certificate by Mrs Sutcliffe for hitting the reading challenge target last term. It would be great in February to see more children be rewarded for this.

Forest School

We wasted no time in continuing with our Forest School sessions, and indeed some of the children were out there last week. As a school we really value the importance of these opportunities to take the curriculum outside. Given the weather we receive at this time of year it is really important that children come to school with additional clothing to wear outside including wellington boots. The dates each class has a Forest School session can be found on the reverse of this newsletter.

Termly Overview

This week, the teachers will be sending home the Termly Overviews for each class. This gives you all the information around the areas of the curriculum the children will be exploring over the next six weeks. By having this, you can then continue to support them from home where possible. <u>PE</u>

This term the children in KS2 (Atlantis, Challenger and Endeavour classes) should bring in warm PE clothes for their football sessions which will take place outside on a Thursday afternoon.

Sickness and Late Arrivals

A reminder to all parents that the only authorised absence is when a child is too unwell to attend school. If we could remind you that once your child is beginning to feel better, they can return to school and if you wish, they can stay inside at break and lunchtimes. Furthermore, if your child is on a course of antibiotics/medicine which must be taken at regular intervals you are welcome to come in and give this to your child, or if this is not possible a senior member of staff will administer the medication, provided you sign to give your permission for this to happen. Should your child need holiday to taken during term time, this cannot be authorised and may incur a Penalty Notice being served on parents by the Local Authority.

It is important that the children are in school every day on time in order that they continue to make the very good progress which all children in our school are now making. School doors are open from 08:40 until 08:50 and children must be in before this time.

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
