

## **NEWSLETTER   Monday 8<sup>th</sup> June 2020**

I write this week's newsletter after the first week of our partial reopening. As you know it has been for EYFS, Year 1 and Year 6 children only. Additionally the key workers' children and vulnerable children have continued to come in as they have done since March 23<sup>rd</sup>. It's hard to believe that we are beginning Week 12 of Lockdown but with more staff and children in school I feel this could be the beginning of what the "new normal" feels like!

I do hope that you are all still following the government guidelines very closely, as although Lockdown has been eased in some ways, the Corona Virus is still very much out there and has the potential to spread rapidly again if we are not very careful.

We are particularly conscious of this in school because with between 15 – 20 children and more adults than before, the danger of spreading the virus is higher and the risk can only be reduced by careful management and everyone playing their part. It is vital that we all stick to the 2 metres social distancing rule and only meet with the allowed number of people. The virus spreads much more easily indoors so we must only meet others outside and not in our houses. Also by continually washing our hands thoroughly and by not touching our faces before we wash our hands then we reduce the risks to an acceptable level that will save lives.

Last week in school was very calm and I believe that our very careful planning beforehand, ensuring that social distancing and strict hygiene measures were all in place, helped a great deal. We now have 30% of children in EYFS, 25% of those in Year 1 and 33% of our Year 6 cohort. Although this is a fairly small proportion of the children, it seemed to fill the "classroom bubbles" they are currently in. The children of Key Workers are in a separate "bubble" of their own each day. Each "bubble" has their daily allocated outside space where the designated children go at break and lunchtimes and for any outdoor learning. The children were incredibly well-behaved, adjusted quickly to the very different type of school that we have had to set up and I am really pleased to say that they all seemed happy with life in this new situation

Please can I ask all parents whose children are coming into school, to only send in their packed lunch which we would like in a plastic carrier bag, or similar, and their plastic drinks' bottle? We do not want any back- packs, lunch boxes, books or anything coming in from home at all. Likewise, we will not send anything home except drinks bottle and of course your child!

Please remember that the children do not need to wear school uniform; they should come into school wearing easy to wash clothes so they have a change of clothing each day. This is another way of minimising the risk of infection.

Year 6 parents, please note that we are still pursuing the deposit paid for the cancelled French Residential visit and are working both with Manor Adventure the owners and the Local Authority insurers. We will let you know as soon as we have any further news on this.

**Year 5 parents** wishing their child to take the Kent Test please remember that registration for the Kent test is now open. It closes on 1<sup>st</sup> July so if you have decided to enter your child for the Kent Test please register them with the Local Authority as soon as possible at [www.kent.gov.uk/ola](http://www.kent.gov.uk/ola).
